

Varsity Courts, Inc. proposes to resurface a battery of three (3) tennis courts according to the following specifications.

All surfacing materials shall be Latex-Ite, manufactured by Dalton Enterprises, Inc. Application of all material shall be done in a workmanlike manner in accordance with the manufacturer's standard specifications.

Pressure wash where necessary

Repair cracks 1/16" or larger using crack filler. The crack filler is worked into the crack with a putty knife by hand.

Repair wide cracks using patch mix. The patch mix is worked into the crack with a putty knife by hand.

Repair large pit holes and gauges using crack filler

Repair several washouts at fence line using patch mix to help lesson standing water

Repair around net post foundation

Net posts to be painted

Reinstall Tennis Court Nets

Quick grind entire slab to remove cracked edges and any loose material

Reason being is that the constant expansion and contraction of more than 7000 sq ft of surface, which is the area of a single tennis court, has a constant fluctuations in ambient temperatures.

These fluctuations can be greater in the winter. The asphalt has lost all flexibility because of aging and the loss of the oils which were in it when manufactured. This causes the asphalt to be rigid.

SCOPE OF WORK:

- 1) Machine sand surface of court.
- 2) Patch large open cracks 1/16" or larger with acrylic patch mix.
- 3) Flood courts and patch any areas holding water per ASBA and USTA guidelines.
- 4) Apply one (1) coat of Acrylic Resurfacer over the entire surface of the court.
- 5) Apply two (2) coats of Color Coating over the entire surface of the court.
 - a. Inbounds Color: Florida Green
 - b. Outbounds Color: Light Green
- 6) Paint regulation tennis court markings with white textured line paint.
- 7) Paint two (2) 60' markings with light green line paint on courts #1 & #2.
- 8) Remove loose material and paint existing net posts green.
- 9) Furnish and install three (1) new tennis nets.

NOTES:

- 1) It is recommended owner should spray insects and vegetation on or around courts two weeks prior to work commencement.
- 2) Water must be allowed to drain from court surface. Do not block water flow on side of court with grass or landscaping.
- 3) Owner to provide suitable access for equipment, water, and electric as required.
- 4) Should owner request additional material applied or other work performed to the surface of court which is not outlined above, it will be at an extra cost.

CRACKS IN TENNIS COURTS:

It should be noted that as your tennis court ages, it will develop cracks. After resurfacing, new cracks may appear and repaired cracks will reappear. Cracks develop in tennis courts for various reasons with the most common being:

- 1) Constant expansion and contraction of more than 7,000 square feet of surface per court in response to constant fluctuations in ambient temperatures. These daily fluctuations are often greatest in winter.
- 2) Loss of flexibility of the asphalt as it ages and loses the oils used in the manufacturing process.
- 3) Changes in subsurface stability reflecting through the court surface.

Nidy does **NOT** provide any written or implied guarantee of tennis courts being free from existing or new cracks; thus, cannot and does not warrant against new cracks appearing or old cracks reappearing after the court has been resurfaced.

The Contractor will pressure clean and power blow court(s) as necessary to remove loose dirt, mildew and oil.

The Contractor will patch depressions greater than 1/8" after 1 hour drying time in sunlight, grind down any ridges as necessary and fill existing cracks as best as possible prior to surfacing.

Note: court must have a minimum of 1% slope in one plane in order to guarantee removal of water.

The Contractor will apply fiberglass mesh strips on the cracks (Court I: 510' / Court II: 470' / Court III: 450').

The Contractor will sand and paint existing net posts.

The Contractor will accurately locate, mark, and paint two inch wide playing lines in accordance with U.S.T.A. regulations using white textured heavy bodied acrylic latex paint.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Nora Brophy. She noted that a

quorum was present to approve official business.

Business Agenda

Old Business/Events

- A. Windermere Petfest Nora commented that she'll be looking to pick a date for next year's event very soon
- **B.** 19th Annual Run Among the Lakes Nora indicated that a note is going out to prospective sponsors for the October 16, 2021 event. She noted that Town Council member Bill Martini is helping with the 2021 shirt designs. Nora also mentioned that she does need a volunteer for help with advertising placement, and to contact her for that.
- C. Tennis The committee discussed progress on several court maintenance issues. These included painting the Main Street backboard, new scorecards added for all courts, and the large dying tree removal at WRC causing court issues. Items still TBD include research on self-locking court gates, fence repairs, and the suggested security camera. Tonya Elliott-Moore indicated that a new paver connector path from sidewalk over to courts at WRC would run approximately \$3850. Dena suggested to add more permanent tennis signage by the courts instead of the laminated messaging now there.
- D. Windermere Rec Center Nora indicated that measurements have been taken along with spacing demands for the proposed playground equipment at WRC. \$3850 has been approved for the playground equipment with the whole project cost estimate around \$40,000. Nora noted that the committee is waiting on the safety fencing estimate for the perimeter around the playground equipment.

The committee discussed the Main Street tennis resurfacing and pickleball court estimates provided by a local vendor. A motion was made and seconded to put out both bid requests, and for the pickleball courts proposed scope of work not to exceed \$25,000. The committee asked that these 2 bids be put out as soon as possible with the hope of Main Street resurfacing staring in August or September.

E. Kayak/Canoe Storage – Discussion ensued around this topic. The consensus of the group is that WRC is the best initial location for this amenity. This

- matter should continue to move forward with more research conducted for pricing.
- F. Doggy Dooleys These were approved by the Town Manager for all parks.

New Business

- A. Boathouses Curt Frazier and George Poelker made guest resident comments regarding the existing Windermere boathouse history and situation. Leases on the boathouses expire in July 2021. The committee discussed the request to make a recommendation to Tow Council on future use for the boathouses and some rough awards process. After some discussion, the committee consensus is/was to create a multi year lottery system to award boathouse use as the fairest way to involve residents in an equitable use process.
- **B.** Meeting minutes from both the March 11, 2021 regular meeting and the April 1, 2021 special Fernwood Park meeting were approved by the committee
- C. Liaison Reports No Liaison was present to present a report.
- **D.** Adjournment The meeting was adjourned at approximately 6:00 p.m. The next regular meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 13th at 5:00 p.m. in Town Hall.
