Pursuant to Resolution No. 2005-12 adopted on December 13, 2005, the following Civility Code shall govern all proceedings before the Town of Windermere Town Council:

- Prolonged conversations shall be conducted outside Council meeting hall.
- Whistling, heckling, gesturing, loud conversations, or other disruptive behavior is prohibited.
- 4. Only those individuals who have signed the speaker list and/or who have been recognized by the Mayor (or Chair) may address comments to the Council.
- Comments at public hearings shall be limited to the subject being considered by the Council.
- Comments at Open Forums shall be directed to Town issues.
- All public comments shall avoid personal attacks and abusive language
- No person attending a Town Council meeting is to harass, annoy, or otherwise disturb any other person in the room.

Any member of the public whose behavior is disruptive and violates the Town of Windermere Civility Code is subject to removal from the Town Council meeting by an officer and such other actions as may be appropriate. PLEASE NOTE: IN ACCORDANCE WITH F.S. 286.0105: Any person who desires to appeal any decision at this meeting will need a record of this proceeding. For this, such person may need to ensure that a verbatim record of such proceeding is made which includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

Windermere Tree Board March 24, 2021

1. <u>Call To Order - Chairman Susan Carter called the regular meeting of the WTB, as an in-person meeting, with a quorum present at 10:04 am on the Town Hall back porch on March 24, 2021.</u>

Tree Board Members present were: Susan Carter, Jackie Rapport, Leslie Brabec, and Frank Krens. Town Council Members, Bill Martini and Andy Williams, and Public Works representative, Travis Mathias, Interim Public Works Director, were present. Town Manager, Robert Smith, and presenter Christiana participated via Zoom.

- 2. Public Comment None
- 3. <u>Approval of Minutes</u> Jackie Rapport made a motion to approve the February 2021 Minutes with one minor correction, Leslie Brabec seconded and they were approved 4/0.

For the convenience of the presenter, Old Business was deferred till after her presentation.

4. New Business

a. "City Nature Challenge Orlando Metro" – Christina ______ described a nature-based program intended to connect people with nature, collect data on species diversity, and have fun. The program involves observation, identification, and reporting of diverse plant and animal species. The program is implemented via a mobile App and motivated through a friendly competition among cities and towns throughout Orange and surrounding counties. During April 30 through May 3, 2021, participants take photos in their neighborhoods, upload them, with the "location" feature on, to the online *iNaturalist* application. Participants are encouraged to identify the species they photograph, and to encourage others to participate.

WTB members committed to participate and promote the program.

5. Old Business

- a. Updates
 - Central Park update & planting project Susan Carter presented pricing from two sources: (1) Dobson \$8750 to procure and plant the 21 trees agreed upon by WTB and

Parks & Recreation. (2) McKeithen - \$1925 to provide the 21 trees only. After discussion, Frank Krens made a motion to buy the 21 trees from McKeithen and for WTB to plant the trees with support from Public Works and volunteers. Leslie Brabec seconded and the motion carried 4/0. WTB will also provide the watering tree diapers, mulch, and soil improvement. Planting is targeted for the third or fourth week of April.

6. <u>Adjourn</u> – Leslie Brabec made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Frank Krens seconded, and the meeting was adjourned.
