Flowering	<i>Melaleuca viminalis</i>	Weeping Bottlebrush	15-20', but can get up to 30'	15-20'	Scarlet blooms; spring, summer, early winter	Full sun	
Flowering	<i>Hamelia patens</i>	Firebush	up to 15'		Bright red flowers; late spring - first frost (flowers attract hummingbirds and butterflies)	Full sun, partial sun	
Flowering	<i>Magnolia grandiflora</i>	"Little Gem" Southern Magnolia	30-35', but can reach 40-60'	8-12', butt can reach 20-30'	White blooms	Full sun, partial sun, partial shade	

Evergreen	<i>Ilex vomitoria</i>	Yaupon Holly	15-25'	15-25'	White blooms, bright red berries (berries can be used to make tea)	Full sun, partial sun	
Evergreen	<i>Quercus virginiana</i>	Live Oak	60-80'	60-120'	Acorns (can attract squirrels, raccoons, and other wildlife)	Full sun, partial shade	
Evergreen	<i>Quercus geminata</i>	Sand Live Oak	Usually up to 50', but have been documented at up to 95'	50-70'	Acorns (can attract squirrels, raccoons, and other wildlife)	Full sun, partial shade	
Fruiting	<i>Diospyros virginiana</i>	Common Persimmon	40-60'	20-35'	White blooms, orange berries (berries can attract raccoons and opossum)	Full sun	
Deciduous	<i>Taxodium distichum</i>	Baldcypress	40-50' in 25 years, but up to 100-150', most stand 60-80'	25-35'	Acorns (can attract squirrels and birds)	Full sun, partial shade	

Deciduous	<i>Taxodium ascendens</i>	Pondcypress	50-60'	10-15'	Small seeds that can attract squirrels and birds	Full sun, partial shade
